Dear friends of Building Hope in Kids - Uganda,

I send you warm regards from Uganda and from St. Patrick Nursery & Primary School in Uganda.



The first two months since the school opening (on Feb. 2) have been great.

We had parents visit the students on March 16 and the day was a great success. Parents were excited to see their children after 6 weeks in boarding school and many of the parents were happy that their children were looking so healthy. Some of the parents could be heard saying "How shall we manage these children when they come for holidays since they eat so well while at school?" I was happy to hear such comments because one of our goals was to improve nutrition of our students.

The headmaster also later told me that parents were so impressed and he said, "I cannot hide this from you, I got so many compliments and gifts from the parents."

The students themselves are very happy. When you ask them about the school you hear comments like, "We eat very well, we have very nice buildings and our teachers are very good to us."

We were blessed with an enrollment of 318 students. That was an amazing start because we projected 200 students. Because of this high opening enrollment we have 19 students who still need sponsors. We are still in need of more funds for construction of dormitories because we predict an increase in enrollment next year.

We are grateful to all those who have supported us since the inception of the project. May the Lord bless you abundantly.

President's Reportfrom John Grillot, BHIK-U Board President

God has continued to shower us with His blessings and we are truly humbled. As previously noted, late last year we were offered a \$200,000 grant with one condition ... that we were to raise \$200,000 "on our own" by the end of April 2019. We accepted the challenge and placed our trust in God. It is with great joy to announce that we have met our goal and have received the matching funds. In honor of the grantor, we have named the soon-to-be-constructed boy's dormitory the **Dan Meehan Hall**. This dormitory will be an ongoing reminder of Dan's goodwill, his confidence in our project, his hope for the future, and his faith in Jesus Christ.

Due to Fr. Julius' successful recruiting and the resulting enrollment of over 300 students, we now need to provide more classroom space and student housing. We plan to resolve this capacity constraint by building boys' and girls' dormitories "complete" during 2019 in preparation for next school year. This will free up classroom space in the classroom building (that is now being used as temporary housing) and provide long-term student housing in separate buildings. Over the next two months the dormitory foundations, concrete slabs, and first level walls will be completed, with much of the work being done during May while the students are on break.

This Phase 2 construction (dormitories and related items) will cost nearly \$500,000. Even after completing Phase 1 construction earlier this year and funding the agreed-upon student sponsorships, we have 70% of the needed funds already available. We are still in need of an additional

\$150,000 to enable us to complete the dormitories this year to continue on the path of building hope for more and more children.

It may be of interest to you that the BHIKU Board of Directors has established several options to acknowledge donors, including: a) room plaques commemorating donor contributions; b) naming rights for selected rooms, sites, and buildings; and c) "Partners in Excellence" donor recognition levels. These options provide a method to commemorate your support and commitment to help the children. Please contact me or one of the other Board members to learn more about these donor opportunities.

While it seems that school has just started, we are already in the 10th week (of 13) of the first threemonth term. Planning is underway for the upcoming 3-week break and for the second term that starts on May 27th. A highlight of the second term will be the official dedication ceremony for the school on Saturday, July 27th. Fr. Julius has assured us that it will be a highly festive day with lots of singing, dancing, and rejoicing. Our upcoming Mission Trip (Jul 20 - Aug 1) will of course include this ceremony. This is a once-in-alifetime opportunity to be part of this event. We now have 8 participants signed up and will have a planning meeting later this month. We could handle several more participants. Please contact me if interested.

As always, we ask for your continued prayers, encouragement and financial support. We have accomplished much, but much is yet ahead. Your generosity is making a difference in the world!
