It was such a great event! Arnie was a big key in making this a success. He promoted the event and sold tickets at St. Monica's in East Peoria. Ben Milligan was the KofC ticket seller at St. Patrick's church. Thanks to the Peoria Chiefs organization for donating HALF our advance ticket sales to BHIK-Uganda. After such a successful month, what does September have in store for us?

I am immensely grateful to all the donors who have supported us since we started fundraising in October, 2016. We are at about 50% of the amount needed for the initial structures that will enable us to open the school in February, 2019. A guiding timeline is:

End of October 2017 November/December 2017 January 2018 Remainder of 2018 February 2019

- Approval of school buildings & campus plans by city authorities in Uganda
 Leveling the grounds, site preparation, and making building blocks/bricks on site
- Building construction commences; fundraising continues
- Recruitment of teachers and students as well as sponsors; fundraising continues
- First students, Grades 1 to 3, begin school at St. Patrick Boarding Primary School
 - Non-boarding students age 4 6 begin day school at St. Patrick's in Uganda

Building Hope In Kids – Uganda was incorporated in April 2017 with the primary purpose to act as a fundraising organization to support building and operating a boarding school in Uganda. With Fr. Julius as the founder, two groups have been established: the formal Board of Directors, and a larger Advisory Council that includes Board members and a number of other interested people. The Board of Directors meets monthly, while the Advisory Council meets about every two months. The Board manages legal, financial, and regulatory requirements associated with a not-forprofit organization, including the bookkeeping and accounting systems and the online donation processing. The Advisory Council includes the Fundraising team, which initiates and coordinates events and manages ongoing donor records, and the Communications team, which manages online and hard copy communications including our website, brochures and newsletters. The Programming team, also part of the Advisory Council, will lead future efforts connecting the two St. Patrick "sister" schools and adult mission trips to Uganda. Along with our all of our supporters, we'll continue working to bring the vision of St. Patrick Boarding Primary School – Uganda to life.
